Peadar Ó Riada - Ceoltóir, Cumadóir, Craoltóir



Tógadh agus cónaíonn Peadar Ó Riada i gCúil Aodha, Co Chorcaí. Mac leis an gcumadóir ceoil aitheanta Seán Ó Riada, tá a aitheantas féin bainte amach aige mar chumadóir agus mar cheoltóir. Cumann sé ceol eaglasta, ceol rince traidisiúnta agus ceol ar an nós Eorpach. Déanann sé obair fiseáin agus scannán agus scríobhann roinnt leabhar, scéalta do pháistí, leabhar ar Sean Nós, altanna agus gearr scéalta éagsúil. Tá sé mar Stiúrthóir Ceoil ar Chór Chúil Aodha ó 1971 agus bíonn sé ag seinnt consairtín go rialta le ceoltóirí áitiúla.

Son of the legendary Seán Ó Riada, Peadar Ó Riada has established himself as a fine composer in his own right. A B.Mus. graduate from University College Cork (1976) Peadar is best known as a composer, musician and Choir Director of Cór Chúil Aodha since 1971. His other interests include film directing and production, bee-keeping, painting, writing, alternative medicine, culture and traditions of different peoples and history. In 2009-'12 a collection of his tunes

was released on the 3CDs *Triúr sa Draighean* which he recorded with Martin Hayes and Caoimhín O'Raghallaigh. Recent work includes *Na Fianna* with na Reacairí, *Continuing Traditions* with Wajahat Khan and assorted settings for voice and piano of recent Irish Poetry,

Tá Keith freagrach as gach a bhaineann le forbairt bhallraíochta & imeachtaí margaíochta na heagraíochta. Ina theannta sin tá sé freagrach as gníomhaíochtaí fógraíochta, bolscaireachta, urraíochta agus ar líne. I gcaitheamh na mblianta tá aitheantas bainte amach aige dá chuid saineolais ar chúrsaí cumadh amhráin agus foilsitheoireachta. Is é a reachtáileann Camchuairt Léirithe IMRO gach bliain. Ina theannta sin tá sé freagrach as na ceardlanna cumadóireachta, seimineáir gnó, agus comhphairtíochtaí rialta eile a bhíonn ar bun ag IMRO. In Earrach na bliana 2005, bhí sé lárnach leis an bhfeachtas Ceol As Éirinn a chur ar bun – togra trína thugtar tacaíocht d' ealaíontóirí Éireannacha freastal ar imeachtaí idirnáisiúnta ar nós SXSW, CMJ agus Eurosonic. Tá an togra

seo imithe i dtreise ó shin i leith.

Keith oversees all of the organisation's membership development and marketing activities. He also oversees all advertising, promotional, sponsorship and online activities. Over the years he has built up a strong reputation for his knowledge of the songwriting and publishing worlds. He runs the annual IMRO Showcase Tour and also handles the regular series of IMRO songwriting workshops, masterclasses, industry seminars and collaborations. In the spring of 2005, Keith was centrally involved in getting the Music From Ireland initiative -supporting Irish artists at international music events like SXSW, CMJ and Eurosonic off the ground. The project has gone from strength to strength.

Ar nós an Clann Lewis agus Meaití J6 Shéamuis Ó Fátharta. Thainig roinnt mhaith eile cuid ceoil trí bheith ag éisteacht le taifid agus an Raidéó. Ó bhog sí baile go Doire Bhanbh i gCamus, is minic í ag seimint i gcuideachtaí Tommy Mellett. Tá aithne forleathan uirthi i dtaoibh a curaimí mar cho-ordaineoir ceoil le RTÉ Raidéó na Gaeltachta agus mar láithreathóir Béal Maidíbe is Ceol na Binn na Neanna. Tá dhá dhlúth dhiosca aice *Draíocht na Feadóige* (2014) agus *An Tower* (2018) ar lipéad Cló Iar-Chonnacht.

Born and raised in Cor na Rón, Indreabhán, Co. Galway, Neansaí learned her music at home on the hearth from her father, Michael Mheáirt Ó Coisdealbha and other local musicians, including the Lewis family and Meaití J6 Shéamais Ó Fátharta. She learned much of her music, also, by listening to recordings and radio programmes. She has played music over the years with Tommy Mellett since she moved to Doire Bhanbh in Camas. She is well-known for her work as Music Co-ordinator with RTÉ Raidió na Gaeltachta and as presenter of the programmes Béal Maidíbe on Sunday mornings and Ceol Binn ó na Beanna three nights a week. She released 2 albums, *Draíocht na Feadóige* (2014), and *An Tower* (2018) on the Cló Iar-Chonnacht label.

## An Dochtúir Tríona Ní Shíocháin

### Léachtóir le Ceol Coláiste na hOlscoile Corcaigh/UCC School of Film, Music and Theatre



Dr Tríona Ní Shíocháin is a whistle-player, singer and interdisciplinary scholar specialising in Irish traditional music, *sean-nós* singing, Irish-language song composers, oral theory, oral composition and transmission, performance theory, ethnomusicology and anthropology, and Irish-language literature, poetry and culture. She graduated with a first class honours degree in Music and Irish from UCC in 2002, and was awarded a PhD for her research on the songs of celebrated nineteenth-century song composer, Máire Bhuí Ní Laoire, in 2008 (UCC). She was lecturer in Irish Language and Literature at the University of Limerick 2007-2017, where she spent a number of years as Head of Irish Language and Literature. She was appointed as Lecturer in Irish Traditional Music at UCC in 2017. She is author of *Bláth 's Craobh na nÚdar: Amhráin Mháire Bhuí* in 2012, which includes a multi-text edition with musical transcriptions of the songs of Máire Bhuí, and also an accompanying CD of archival and field recordings, as well as analysis and theoreticization of the songs. Her current research concerns the liminality of song and the role of song in thought formation in society, and she is author of recently published monograph *Singing Ideas: Performance, Politics and Oral Poetry* (Berghahn 2018). She has also published on oral theory, creative transmission and oral composition in the Irish song tradition, on liminality, song performance and thought formation, and has also written on permanent liminality and subject formation in modern Irish poetry.

## Antoine Ó Coileáin

### Príomhfheidhmeannach Chief Executive Gael Linn



Bunaíodh Gael Linn i 1953 ar mhaithe le fiontair úra a chur chun cinn chun leasa na Gaeilge. Leanann an comhlacht leis an bhfealsúnacht fiontraíochta a chur chun cinn tríd an réimse leathan d'imeachtaí a dtugann foireann Gael Linn fúthu ó bhliain go bliain. Is í príomhaidhm na heagraíochta ná an Ghaeilge agus a hoidhreacht a chothú agus a chur chun cinn ar fud na hÉireann i réimsí polasaí agus pobail, mar theanga bheo agus mar spreagadh féiniúlachta. Cuimsíonn gníomhchlár Gael Linn trí phríomhréimse; an réimse oideachais, gníomhaíochtaí chun tacaí le húsáid na Gaeilge agus réimse gnó na heagraíochta.

Gael Linn was founded in 1953 and has been known since then as an entrepreneurial organisation. The main aim of the organisation is to foster and promote the Irish language and its heritage throughout Ireland as a living language and as an expression of identity. Gael Linn continues to implement its entrepreneurial philosophy through the broad range of activities and projects which it engages in from year to year. The Gael Linn programme can be divided into three broad categories; education, language promotional schemes and business.
